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# DP WORLD EXPANDS EUROPEAN INLAND NETWORK THROUGH SWISSTERMINAL TENDER SUCCESS TO OPERATE THREE ALSACE PORTS

DP World has significantly expanded its European inland network,labore



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Earlier this month, the public authority Syndicat Mixte des Ports du Sud Alsace (SMO) awarded the concession contract of the Ports of Mulhouse-Rhin to the public-private company composed of the SMO, the Caisse des Dépôts et Consignations and Alsaceteam (joint venture of Swissterminal and the two French seaports Grand Port Maritime de Marseille and Haropa Port du Havre.

The operation of the three French inland ports is granted through a sub delegation contract to Alsaceterminal, a wholly owned subsidiary of Swissterminal, which will take over Ottmarsheim, Huningue-Village-Neuf and Ile Napoléon ports in the course of 2021.

DP World believes this is a hugely positive announcement for the firm and its customers as it allows expansion of its already vast network across Europe, thereby offering greater geographic range, more transport solutions, and an increased number of connections.

More specifically the move will improve transport connections in the border triangle region between France, Switzerland and Germany, which holds such economic importance for numerous industries such as chemicals, metals, food processing, and construction.

The strategic location of the ports is also expected to grow in significance in the near future. New rail connections due to be implemented will link them to the two main French seaports of Le Havre and Marseille-Fos, while inland shipping to the largest North Range ports of Rotterdam (Netherlands) and Antwerp (Belgium) will be strengthened.

### BRUSSELS AIRPORT SEES ACCELERATED CARGO GROWTH

250,065 passengers passed through Brussels Airport in April, down 89% on April 2019.

This very low number is explained by the ban on non-essential travel which remained in effect until the April 18 and the array of travel restrictions and conditions. Cargo traffic continues its strong growth with a 72% increase on the same period in 2020.



The very good start of the year with strong growth in cargo volumes . continued and even accelerated through April, largely due to the high demand for air cargo across Europe.

Contrary to the passenger figures, cargo volumes are compared to the 2020 figures as the COVID pandemic has had only a limited impact on cargo volumes in 2020. The growth of air freight compared to 2020 is remarkable in all segments, in the integrator segment (+ 55), the full-freighter segment (+59%) and even in belly cargo, which rebounded from very low volumes in April 2020 (+492%).

# ASIAN PORTS DOMINATE NEW CONTAINER TERMINAL

EFFICIENCY INDEX

The new global Container Port Performance Index (CPPI), launched by the World Bank and IHS Markit, ranks Yokohama, as the world's most efficient port ahead of King Abdullah Port, Saudi Arabia and Qingdao, China.

The index finds that Asian container ports are the most efficient in the world, dominating the Top 50 spots. Despite being the highest ranked European port Algeciras in Spain is at position 10 in the index. Colombo in Sri Lanka is the top-ranked port in South Asia at 17th place and Mexico's Lazaro Cardenas leads the Americas at 25th.

Canada's Halifax is the only other North American port in the Top 50. Djibouti, in 61st place, is the top-ranked African port. The index, the first of its kind, is a comparison of global container port performance that is intended to identify gaps and opportunities for improvement in container port operations.

The index scored ports against different metrics, making the efficiency ranking comparable around the globe by assessing and standardising for different ship sizes and container moves per call. It is based on total port hours per ship call, defined as the elapsed time between when a ship reaches a port to its departure from the berth having completed its cargo exchange.

The index indicates that key port performance metrics such as minutes per container move show large discrepancies in global port efficiency. While top performers such as Yokohama take just 1.1 minutes on average to load or unload a container in a standard port call, the average for equivalent workloads in African ports is more than three times that at 3.6 minutes.
